Financial Highlights

Church Activity

Regular offerings (Sunday. Christmas, Easter and Holy days) account for 78% of our church's annual ordinary operating income. Mass attendance and parishioner engagement remain sluggish in returning to their pre-COVID levels and this is felt keenly in our collections total. While our Mass offerings improved over FY22, they fell short of budget by almost \$70K (10%.) Other revenue categories (religious education tuition and fees, Mass stipends, and interest) met or exceeded budget. Oktoberfest 2022 was a particularly bright spot as both a fun-raising and fundraising success.

On the expense side, all of us have felt the sharp pinch of inflation and while the parish perpetually strives to curb discretionary spending, rising costs and surcharges have impacted our operating expenditures. Salary expense and utilities together represent nearly 70% of the church's total operating expense and finished 5% under budget for the year. Nearly every other category was over budget to some extent, primarily repair and maintenance expense as well as renewed investment in our liturgical, music and religious education ministries. The Archdiocese deployed new platforms for standardizing accounting and human resources, further increasing our administrative costs.

Altogether, the church finished with an operating deficit of \$20K which was covered by reserves.

Close to 50% of regular offerings are received through some avenue of electronic or automated giving and we are grateful for your enduring support of those tools. Last year our primary platform, GiveCentral, added the option for donors to cover the processing fee as a tax-deductible component to their giving. If you haven't modified your recurring gift in a while, we encourage you to prayerfully consider an offering increase, and to add the option to cover the fee. School Activities

Tuition and fees account for the majority of our income, supported by advancement office outreach, outside scholarship funding, the Annual School Fund in the fall and Gala in the spring. Be sure to read Fundraising Highlights for more information about those activities! Overall, school operating revenue came in just a hair under budget by \$49K (<1%.)

Salaries and benefit costs are our single greatest expense, and staffing appropriately without sacrificing academic integrity is a perpetual challenge. School leadership, supported by the school advisory board and strategic plan team, continually mine avenues for recognizing our dedicated teachers and staff in tangible and creative ways.

Another primary focus of funds is the repair and maintenance of our aging facilities. Aside from inflationary cost increases, we experienced several failures in plumbing, sewage and HVAC delivery systems that resulted in an extraordinarily large increase in one-time maintenance costs.

Overall, through careful stewardship of resources, the school completed the year with an operating surplus of \$177K.



Extraordinary & Capital Improvements

By Archdiocesan definition, capital expenditures are any project (improvement or repair) with a total cost exceeding \$10,000. One such project stole the show, coming in just under \$1.4 million for FY23: new boiler plants. The project included demolition and replacement of the boilers for the church/school buildings 1, 2, and 4, the rectory and St. Kateri Center, along with associated abatement, masonry, drainage/plumbing and new electrical service in the gym basement.

Coming in a distant second at \$67K but more glamorous to behold were finishing touches to the upper school library renovation, and Heidenreich Hall updates and bathroom remodeling. Rounding out our capital expenses were various repairs to the a/c chiller, radiators and traps, and new flooring in the church basement meeting space.

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Fundraising Highlights

Oktoberfest: \$47,735 after expenses; \$4,825 to endowment, \$42,909 for operating.

Oktoberfest has returned as a beloved community event and fundraiser for the parish, The proceeds of more than \$47K from the October 2022 event are a testament to the committee, volunteers and guests who made the weekend a grand success! These funds helped underwrite the cost of new programs to foster and grow parishioner engagement, building the covenant with St. Andrew Parish, and to general operating. Thank you for supporting this great event. Prost!



Gala: \$115,855 Fund-a-Need for financial assistance; \$165,000 to school operating budget, \$31,514 to endowment, and \$118,730 remains in reserve. More than \$430,000 raised!

The elegant "Under the Big Top" Gala, held at Rockwell on the River, benefitted from enthusiastic guests, beautiful spring weather and an amazing event committee. We had our most profitable year ever! We easily met our budget of \$165,000 to cover school operating expenses. Our paddle raise brought in over \$115K for financial assistance to award for the 2023-24 school year. Our generous patrons raised over \$118K beyond the budgeted goal. These funds have been set aside to help pay for initiatives that will be driven by our 2023-28 Strategic Plan: Living Our Mission. What a great way to kick off a new strategic plan! We are currently prioritizing facilities needs according to this plan and hope to use these additional funds to support some needed projects. Thank you to Gala Chairs Amy Cupples, Kat Neenan, and Becky Schick for their amazing efforts.

SBPS Advisory Board's Annual School Fund: \$175,000 operating budget, \$124,990 for new teacher laptops.

Parents demonstrated great support for our faculty and staff. We quickly reached our goal of \$175,000 to help support faculty stipends to increase annual

earnings while paying them for essential curriculum and leadership work. The Beyond the Budget Challenge Goal helped to raise funds to provide each faculty member with a new Microsoft Surface Laptop. Thank you to the 2022-23 School Advisory Board for their dedication and leadership.

Home and School Association Annual Fun Run – Raised over \$150,000.

Each September, our school family joins together in the courtyard for some music, running and FUN! The 2022 Fun Run raised over \$150,000 for the HSA operating costs. The bulk of these funds support teacher appreciation gifts as well as special school initiatives. The teachers and staff receive a generous Christmas gift as well as a spring gift. This year's special initiative was the installation of new security and emergency communications panels throughout the campus. This project cost over \$87K, but our students and staff are now safer with these new panels. Thank you! Additional funding also covered some playground equipment for elementary school students.



Baby and Kids Garage Sale 2022: \$26,960 after expenses; 10% to endowment (\$2,696) and remainder (\$24,264) to teacher grants.

The much-anticipated annual Baby and Kids Garage Sale is always an incredible event which raises money for teacher classroom wish list items. Chair, Jen Stull, and her incredible team ran an efficient event that brought in shoppers from all over Chicagoland. Leftover items are generously donated to organizations around the city who support children, parents and families in need. Each year, teachers apply for classroom grants – items that teachers would love to have for their classrooms. Last year's Garage Sale committee funded items such as musical instruments, physical education equipment, STEM lab equipment, art supplies, and more. Students in grades
